Agnes Scott College invites applications for a tenure-track position at the assistant rank for a scholar with a cross-disciplinary background in the fields of international relations and women's studies with an interest in human rights. This position is part of a cluster hire with a geographic focus on the Middle East. The 3/2 teaching load will include at least one course supporting the college's global learning initiative and upper-level courses in the candidate's specialty. Additional courses could include Introduction to Human Rights, Feminist Research Methodology, and/or courses on international law and organizations. PhD in Political Science, Women's Studies, or a related field preferred; advanced ABDs considered. The successful candidate will possess college-level teaching experience and a commitment to working with a socially and economically diverse student population. College Avenue, Decatur, GA 30030. Applications will be reviewed beginning October 15. Additional materials—including syllabi, teaching evaluations and statement on teaching, writing sample, and graduate transcripts—will be solicited from selected applicants later in the search process. The search committee will conduct interviews at the National Women's Studies Association and Middle Eastern Studies Association conferences in November 2014, but it is not necessary for applicants to attend either conference to be eligible for this position.

Located in metropolitan Atlanta, Agnes Scott College is a highly selective national liberal arts college for women. Excellence in undergraduate teaching, an effective and sustainable research program, and service to the department and the college are necessary for tenure and promotion. Faculty development programs include travel funding, internal research grants, and a one-semester leave at full pay after successful completion of the third-year review.
